
Means of Transport





On:

We use "on" when we place something somewhere, use public transport or talk about time.

Public transport: on the bus, train, boat, plane, but we ride "in" a taxi / a car / a lorry.

By:

We use "by" when we place something, talk about time, about ways and means, in passive sentences and when passing someone/thing.

Ways and means:

- By the way, we go
- "by" all means of transport, except if we walk. Then we go "on foot". We go "by" all means of transport e.g. by car = by road, by boat = by sea/river, by plane = by air, by train = by rail/underground.
- The letter was sent by post.
- You are Norwegian by birth.
- I met her by chance.
- By means of. By all means. By no means.
